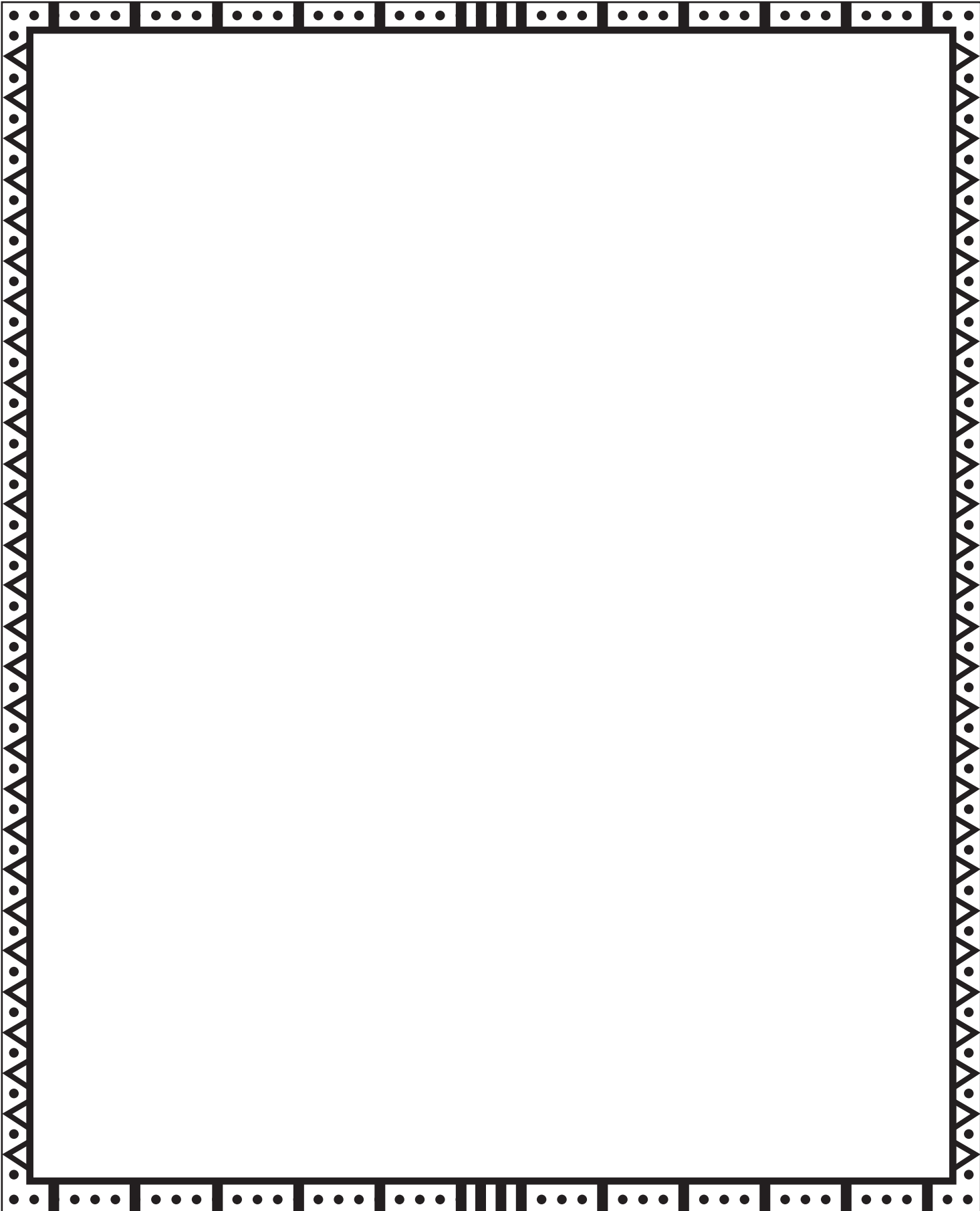
Think about the next part of Grace's story. How do you think she feels about school now and what might she like to do when she grows up?

Amazing Grace video transcript

Are you hungry? Really hungry? No... really hungry?

Did you know there are still kids in the world who are so poor they haven't eaten in days?

In fact, there are 300 million chronically hungry children in the world.

Grace is just one of them. Grace is 10 years old. She lives in Malawi. Grace is an orphan and has lots of brothers and sisters to look after. There isn't enough food for them so Grace works, begs or forages just so they can survive. This means Grace can't go to school. She will never learn to read or write. When she grows up, if she grows up, she can't earn a living and if Grace has children, they will be born into the same poverty as she was.

61 million children are out of school. 8,000 children die every day from hunger-related causes. In a world that grows enough food for everyone this is not right,

Something must be done. Something can be done. Mary's Meals is a simple solution. We provide one daily meal in a place of learning. This meal attracts children to school for the first time and the children can concentrate in class. Education gives children the best hope of a future free from poverty. With Mary's Meals, Grace's story looks very different.

Grace gets a nutritious meal and learns lots. Grace's education doesn't just benefit her, it helps her whole community.

Education:

- Encourages good government
- Raises crop yields
- Promotes gender equality
- Fosters peace
- Tackles corruption
- Boosts economic growth
- Reduces poverty
- Improves health

... and saves children's lives.

So, when Grace has children of her own, they have a better start than she did.

Mary's Meals feeds hundreds of thousands of children every school day. At least 93% of donations goes directly on our charitable activities. We rely on an army of volunteers.
